INFANT PE

This is just a short reminder to send your child to school in their full winter PE kit on PE days from next week. They will spend much more time doing PE and playing outside whilst being warm and dry. All timetables are on your child's class page on the website. <u>PE kits are</u> <u>not required for infant dance.</u>

Infant water bottles cause many issues in school. They spill into bags, are dropped and broken, and often children drink from 'other' bottles by mistake, which is not the best over the winter sniffs and colds season.

The main concern, however, is ensuring that such young children are adequately hydrated, and this should be carefully monitored as routine practice during the school day.

From Monday, the infant staff will sit their class down together before morning and afternoon break time and ensure that at least a cup of milk or water is finished. This will obviously not be forced, but the staff will easily be able to spot those children who may need gentle encouragement. Free access to water from a clean cup will also be available throughout the day.

The lunchtime staff will also carefully monitor the infants' drink cups before the children leave the table.

Therefore, from Monday, please do not send a water bottle to school; just a healthy snack.
